

Fun Bible Facts

Schools in New Testament times

While the word "school" occurs in the Bible only once (Acts 19:9), there are numerous references to teachers and teaching in both Testaments.

Girls received their education at home. Girls would learn a variety of skills such as weaving, spinning, and treating illnesses. She might also learn to sing and dance and play a musical instrument such as a flute or harp.

Boys usually began formal schooling at age five. He would spend at least a half day, six days a week for about five years, studying at the synagogue. Parents brought their son at daybreak and came for him at midday. While not at school the boy was usually learning a trade, such as farming or carpentry.

If a boy wanted training beyond that given in a synagogue, he would go to a scholarly scribe. Saul of Tarsus received such advanced theological training "at the feet of Gamaliel" in Jerusalem (Acts 22:3).
