

PAUL'S THIRD MISSIONARY JOURNEY

ACTS 18:23-21:17



REGIONS OF GALATIA AND PHRYGIA

After spending some time in Antioch, Paul set out from there and traveled from place to place throughout the region of Galatia and Phrygia, strengthening all the disciples.

EPHESUS

Paul entered the synagogue and spoke boldly there for three months, arguing persuasively about the kingdom of God. But some of them became obstinate; they refused to believe and publicly maligned the Way. So Paul left them and had discussions daily in the lecture hall of Tyrannus. This went on for two years, so that all the Jews and Greeks who lived in the province of Asia heard the word of the Lord.

MACEDONIA AND GREECE

Paul set out for Macedonia. He traveled through that area, speaking many words of encouragement to the people, and finally arrived in Greece, where he stayed three months. Because the Jews made a plot against him just as he was about to sail for Syria, he decided to go back through Macedonia. Paul sailed from Philippi and five days later arrived at Troas. Paul decided to sail past Ephesus to avoid spending time in the province of Asia, for he was in a hurry to reach Jerusalem.

ON TO JERUSALEM

Paul met the elders from Ephesus in Miletus. From there he put out to sea and sailed straight to Cos, then to Rhodes and from there to Patara. He found another ship and sailed to the South of Cyprus and landed at Tyre. Paul left Tyre and made several other stops on his way to Jerusalem.
